- 1. ASA's advisory role with the recently created global Mite Specialist Group (MSG).
 - a. Dr. Sebahat Sullivan is the chair, others on the group include: Maria Arnova (?) and Ashley Dowling, 37 members from 28 countries on 5 continents.
 - b. "The group will aim to have a number of activities and projects established or completed by the end of 2021, e. g., establish links to the IUCN agencies, governments, universities and research institutions, acarology societies, the private sector and NGOs to better incorporate mite conservation into research, education and conservation initiatives, have a number of mite species assessed for the IUCN Red List, establish a website devoted to mite conservation issues; and contact conservation-oriented scientific journals to encourage them to support the publication of mite conservation research; and produce media releases about the intrinsic and ecological importance of mites."
 - c. In essence, MSG members and advisory groups are encouraged to do whatever they can personally and through their networks to contribute to a global effort to conserve mite diversity through research, education, advocacy and direct conservation initiatives, e. g.,
 - i. consider species for red listing via the MSG; we can also do red list assessments of ecosystems
 - ii. contribute images, text and links to a MSG website that will promote mites and their conservation
 - iii. support and engage in ecological studies that contribute to real conservation gains
 - iv. form direct links with NGOs (e. g. conservation groups, farmer organizations, reforestation societies), landholders and government agencies to achieve measurable conservation outcomes
 - v. support and contribute to initiatives that address habitat destruction, climate change, pollution and other drivers of biodiversity loss
 - vi. work to incorporate mites (and other invertebrates) into the fabric of the biology and curricula in schools and higher education institutions
 - vii. encourage journals to publish research related to mite conservation issues
 - viii. establish links with media and a presence in on-line platforms to promote the group and its activities
 - ix. educate/inform governments, conservation area managers and the public about the fundamental role that mites and the other invertebrates play in diverse, healthy, productive ecosystems.
 - d. Will be asking us for input, promoting conservation, no mention yet of any monetary commitments

- e. Lorena suggests that a person represent ASA to attend their meetings, be involved, connect ASA community where needed, and report back to ASA board and ASA as a whole
- f. 2-3 year term?
- g. Patricia suggests that person is knowledgeable and has extension/outreach experience.
- h. Alexandra suggests that extension, conservation members of ASA could form group that would be supportive or connect with them as a group.
- i. Ray is interested in doing it and could create a task force up to 4 if needed
 - i. Monica volunteered to help in the future as well
- j. Board voted for Ray to be our representative and pull together task force if needed.
